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1st Working session about Concepts for handling major disaster events

Moderated by Heinzpeter Moecke, Hamburg, Sergey Bagnenko, St. Petersburg talked about „Facit of major disaster events in Russia in 2009“, Alexey Boikov, St. Petersburg about „Major disaster handling in St. Petersburg“, Manfred Kanzler, Hamburg about „Preparation on Major International Events by the Security Authorities“ with Examples of the FIFA Football Worlds Championship 2006 and 2010, Susanne Matzke-Ahl, Munich about „Air Rescue in Germany – Organization, financing and medical services and Julia Shoigu, Moscow finally about „Organization of the psychological service of the Russian Ministry for Catastrophe Protection“.
